Subject: Invitation to the Initial Planning Meeting of the West and Central Africa

Flash Flood Guidance System (WCAFFGS) to be held on 14 March 2024

Action required: Inform on participation to the WCAFFGS Initial Planning Meeting (online)

Dear Sir/Madam,

Recognizing the disastrous impact on lives and properties of affected populations by flash floods, the World Meteorological Organization (WMO), jointly with the United States (US) National Weather Service (NWS), the Hydrologic Research Centre (HRC) and the US Agency for International Development/Bureau for Humanitarian Assistance (USAID/BHA), have developed the concept of the Flash Flood Guidance System (FFGS) with global coverage to assist forecasters in providing the guidance to issue timely and accurate flash flood warnings for small basins. The concept has been endorsed by the Fifteenth World Meteorological Congress and is implemented through regional projects.

I am pleased to invite you, as the Permanent Representative and the Hydrological Adviser, to the Initial Planning Meeting on establishing a FFGS for West and Central Africa regions, which will be held online on 14 March 2024. The purposes of this meeting are to provide an introduction on the fundamentals of the FFGS, its potential development and to better understand your willingness to access the FFGS.

Based on the conclusions and recommendations of this meeting, endorsed by each Permanent Representative via a letter of commitment to the WMO Secretary-General, the development and implementation of the West and Central Africa Flash Flood Guidance System (WCAFFGS) covering: Benin, Cabo Verde, Côte d'Ivoire, The Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Liberia, Mauritania, Nigeria, Senegal, Sierra Leone, and Togo for West Africa; and Angola, Burundi, Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Congo, Democratic Republic of Congo, Equatorial Guinea, Gabon, Rwanda and São Tomé and Príncipe for Central Africa; will be carried out with funding provided by USAID/BHA and the Climate Risk and Early Warning Systems (CREWS) in West and Central Africa projects.

The Initial Planning Meeting is expected to take place online on Thursday, 14 March 2024, from 1200 to 1500 UTC, including simultaneous interpretation in English and French.
