Subject: Ship Observations Team (SOT) – National submission for the SOT Annual Report for 2018

Action required: Submit input for the SOT Annual Report 2018 by **31 January 2019**

Dear Sir/Madam,

You will recall that the Ship Observations Team (SOT) was re-established by the Joint WMO/IOC Technical Commission for Oceanography and Marine Meteorology (JCOMM) during its fifth session (JCOMM-5), held in Geneva, Switzerland, from 25 to 29 October 2017. The SOT provides for a mechanism to coordinate implementation activities of the Voluntary Observing Ship (VOS) Scheme, the Ship-of-Opportunity Programme (SOOP), and the Automated Shipboard Aerological Programme (ASAP).

For the purpose of collecting necessary information to be included in the 2018 SOT Annual Report, instructions for the preparation and completion of your country's report(s) are indicated in the Annex. In particular, I would like to invite you to check the lists of national contact points for the SOT, VOS, SOOP, ASAP and Port Meteorological Officers that can be obtained from the web pages indicated in the Annex, and to report any discrepancies or required changes to the WMO Secretariat, to the attention of Ms Champika Gallage (cgallage@wmo.int).

In line with the WMO Integrated Global Observing System (WIGOS) pre-operational phase for 2016-2019, JCOMM is closely working with WMO-led Global Climate Observing System (GCOS) and Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission of UNESCO- (IOC-UNESCO) led Global Ocean Observing System (GOOS) to propose new observing network implementation targets and performance metrics. From that perspective, the feedback from the National Reports will be critical.

Please download the required forms from the webpage indicated in the Annex, fill them in as appropriate, and return them by email as instructed in the Annex no later than **31 January 2019**.

 - iv. Sending the individual programme VOS / SOOP / ASAP report(s) to the appropriate chairpersons.
 - v. Submitting the completed SOT and VOS / SOOP / ASAP parts (as appropriate) to: cgallage@wmo.int with copy to the SOT Technical Coordinator (ship-tc@jcommops.org) **by 31 January 2019**.
