Dear Sir/Madam,

I am pleased to inform you that the Australian Bureau of Meteorology will host the tenth Asia/Oceania Meteorological Satellite Users' Conference (AOMSUC-10) in Melbourne, Australia from 2 to 7 December 2019.

Past AOMSUC Conferences have been very effective in promoting satellite observations and advancing application areas, focusing on regional issues, informing on recent advances in remote sensing science, fostering dialogue between satellite operators and the user community on current and future satellites and engaging young scientists. This conference is the eminent scientific and technical event in the Asia-Pacific for those working in satellite remote sensing with applications in meteorology, climatology, oceanography and related fields.

The attendees will include world leaders in the field of satellite meteorology, satellite operators, leading scientists from around the world, and major users in the Asia/ Oceania region. The conference is designed to further enhance information exchange activities on various application techniques among satellite data users, to advance satellite observation technologies and to further prepare the Asia/Oceania region for taking full advantage of the new generation satellites.

Associated with the conference, there will be a coordination meeting of the RA V task team on satellite utilization, and the RA II WIGOS Project to develop support for National Meteorological and Hydrological Services (NMHSs) in satellite data and products which will take place on 7 December 2019. The meeting will be instrumental in determining satellite data user requirements and the related training needs of each Member and will provide guidance to satellite operators in their data provision plans.

In addition, the Bureau of Meteorology and AOMSUC's co-sponsors will co-organize a training event on satellite data utilization, designed specifically for satellite data users from the Asia/Oceania region, on 2 and 3 December 2019. This event will consist of a series of lectures and practical training, which will allow your NMHS to identify and express its needs for training in accessing and using satellite data.

In this regard, I would like to invite you or your representative to participate in the above-mentioned events in Melbourne, Australia:

- Training event, focus on satellite data and products: 2 and 3 December 2019;
- (2) Plenary session of AOMSUC-10 Conference: from 4 to 6 December 2019; and
- (3) Coordination Meeting of RA II WIGOS Project and Meeting of RA V Task Team on Satellite Utilization: 7 December 2019.

I would strongly encourage the participation of your NMHS in all three events to ensure that it derives the maximum benefit from the expertise and knowledge sharing that will be present thereby strengthening mutual collaboration between users and satellite data providers particularly in the Asia/Oceania region.
