Dear Sir/Madam,

I am pleased to inform you that the Government of the United States of America has kindly agreed to host the RA IV Workshop on Hurricane Forecasting and Warning in Miami, Florida, from 20 April to 1 May 2020. Eight working days will be allocated to the hurricane forecasting and warning component (20-29 April) and two working days (30 April and 1 May) to training on how to reach out to and communicate better with emergency managers.

The workshop will be conducted in English only at the Regional Specialized Meteorological Centre - Hurricane Center (RSMC-HC) of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration/National Weather Service (NOAA/NWS) in Miami. Please find attached herewith an outline of the Provisional Programme (Annex II) and an Information Note for Participants (Annex III).

The workshop will provide training for hurricane forecasters from the region, assist RA IV Members in their efforts to improve operational tropical cyclone forecasting and warning, and help participants to understand and communicate better with the stakeholders engaged in the emergency decision-making process. Designed particularly for meteorologists with practical experience in operational tropical cyclone forecasting, the workshop will provide them with refresher training and updated information.

I am pleased, therefore, to invite you to nominate an expert on hurricane forecasting and warning from your Service to participate in this workshop. To ensure the effectiveness and positive impacts of the workshop on the work of your service, it is strongly recommended that the nominated expert be a forecaster who is currently engaged in hurricane and associated weather forecasting, has a direct link to the operational tasks of your service, and meets the following requirements:

- Holds a university qualification or equivalent, preferably in geo-sciences (meteorology, hydrology, geophysics, environmental sciences, etc.);
- Is expected to continue working in your Service for a long period after (2) participation in the workshop;

PROVISIONAL PROGRAMME

While the workshop will include lectures and presentations, emphasis will be placed on group interactions and practical, hands-on exercises. The main subject areas to be covered will include:

- (a) The large-scale tropics an overview
- (b) An overview of hurricane research
- (c) Tropical analysis and tropical waves
- (d) Marine forecasting and other TPC/TAFB products
- (e) Satellite applications, including rainfall, the Dvorak technique, microwave and scatterometer
- (f) Tropical cyclone genesis and structure
- (g) NWP, ensemble forecasting, and TC track prediction models
- (h) Developing a user focus
- (i) Doppler radar
- (j) Storm surge
- (k) Extratropical transition
- (I) Interannual and intraseasonal TC variability/Seasonal forecasting
- (m) Best track, CLIPER and wind radii CLIPER/Wind speed probabilities
- (n) TC track and intensity forecasting
- (o) Operational TC forecasting and advisory preparation
- (p) Communication and coordination with emergency managers. Messaging:
 - (i) Hurricane Risk
 - (ii) Tropical Cyclone Hazards (wind, rain, storm surges, tornadoes, ...)
 - (iii) Uncertainty
 - (iv) NHC Advisory Products
 - (v) NHC Wind Speed Probability and Storm Surge Products
- (q) The Hurricane Liaison Team (Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency)
- (r) Coordination with the media
- (s) Quiz for the whole workshop

The programme will also include current weather map discussions.

Note: 8 working days will be allocated to the hurricane forecasting and warning component and 2 working days will be specifically dedicated to training on effective outreach techniques and communicating better with emergency managers. The workshop will last for a total of 12 days, including one weekend.

3. Immigration and health requirements

Very important information

Participants MUST bring with them US dollars, travellers cheques and/or cash for the length of their stay. There are NO BANKS in Miami that will cash a cheque, even United States Federal Government cheques unless the person has an account in the bank.

5. Accommodation

WMO has negotiated a group rate of US\$ 99.00 per person per suite per night, plus 13% government tax with the "Candlewood Suite" hotel. 6. Transportation
