In line with the WMO Integrated Global Observing System (WIGOS) implementation, Ocean observing networks are working closely with the WMO led Global Climate Observing System (GCOS) and the Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission of UNESCO (IOC-UNESCO) led Global Ocean Observing System (GOOS) to propose new observing network implementation targets and performance metrics. From that perspective, the feedback from the National Reports will be critical.
