Dear Sir/Madam,

The World Meteorological Organization (WMO) Severe Weather Forecasting Programme (SWFP) has been implemented in various subregions of the world including Eastern Africa. SWFP makes efficient use of the 'cascading forecasting process' with contributions from the WMO Integrated Processing and Prediction System (WIPPS) Centres. Numerical Weather Prediction (NWP) outputs are made available from the contributing World Meteorological Centres (WMCs) and the daily severe weather forecast guidance product is issued to the National Meteorological and Hydrological Services (NMHSs) by the relevant Regional Centre(s) in each subregion.

Within the framework of SWFP-Eastern Africa, WMCs in Exeter (United Kingdom) and Washington and the European Centre for Medium-Range Weather Forecasts (ECMWF) contribute to the regional subprogramme, while the daily severe weather forecasting guidance products are issued by the Regional Specialized Meteorological Centres (RSMCs) in Nairobi and Dar es Salaam towards the NMHSs of participating countries.

With help from our development partners and donors and in support of the United Nations Early Warnings for All (EW4All) initiative, SWFP is being scaled up including geographical expansion to more countries and subregions for the improvement of severe weather guidance products as appropriate and possible. Currently, SWFP-Eastern Africa involves nine countries including Burundi, Djibouti, Ethiopia, Kenya, Rwanda, Somalia, South Sudan, United Republic of Tanzania, and Uganda. Both Djibouti and Somalia agreed to join SWFP-Eastern Africa in 2023 by designating their national SWFP focal points, and this year Eritrea and Sudan will also be invited to consider joining SWFP-Eastern Africa as feasible.

The implementation of the SWFP-Eastern Africa has been managed by a Regional Subproject Management Team (RSMT) which mainly comprises designated SWFP focal points/experts from the participating countries and the contributing WMCs and RSMCs. The RSMT is responsible for overseeing the SWFP regional subprogramme including the review and updating of the regional severe weather operational plan in close coordination with the East African Community (EAC) meteorological bodies. The RSMT will also review the status of impact-based forecast and warning services (IBFWS) and Common Alerting Protocol (CAP) implementation in participating countries in consideration of the EW4All initiative.

To that end, at the kind invitation of the Government of United Republic of Tanzania, the WMO Secretariat, in collaboration with the RSMC Dar es Salaam and RSMC Nairobi, and with financial support from the Finish Meteorological Institute (FMI) through the FINKERAT project (funded by the Government of Finland), and the Climate Risk and Early Warning Systems CREWS Horn of Africa project, is organizing a meeting of RSMT of SWFP-Eastern Africa in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, from 14 to 17 May 2024. The provisional agenda and meeting documents will be made available on the WMO Community Platform.
