Dear Sir/Madam,

I would like to inform you that the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) will be organizing a Training Workshop on Radio Frequency (RF) matters for the Asia-Pacific Region hosted by the WMO Regional Office for Asia and the South-West Pacific in Singapore, the Republic of Singapore, **on 3-4 March 2025**. The Training Workshop will be conducted **in a hybrid format**.

The main objectives of the Training Workshop are as follows:

- to increase awareness of National Meteorological and Hydrological Services (NMHS) in the Asia-Pacific region of the importance of meteorological related spectrum protection and the growing need for their participation in national and international spectrum management activities especially in framework of preparation to ITU World Radiocommunication Conferences;
- to foster the development of new experts in the field of spectrum management in the region from which the membership of the WMO ET-RFC can be sustained, addressing capacity development and succession planning risks identified by ET-RFC.

In this regard, I would like to invite you as a national focal point for RF matters to participate in the training workshop.

## **LOCAL WEATHER**

Singapore is situated near the equator and has a tropical climate. There is abundant rainfall, high and uniform temperatures typically between 25 to 32 degrees, and high relative humidity between 64% to 93%. Rainfall is plentiful in Singapore and short duration showers/thunderstorms in the afternoon are common.

## **GETTING AROUND SINGAPORE**

### By train/By Bus

Singapore's has a comprehensive rail system, known as the MRT (Mass Rapid Transit). Alternatively, you may utilize Singapore's extensive bus network.

You may use the following options to pay for MRT/Bus journeys:

1. Get a Singapore Tourist Pass (STP), a special EZ-Link stored-value card which will allow you unlimited travel for one day (S\$17), two days (S\$24) or three days (S\$29). The Pass can be bought at the TransitLink Ticket Office at selected MRT stations. They are also available daily at the Automated STP Kiosks at Orchard station, HarbourFront station, and Changi Airport station (Terminal 2 and 3) near the Transitlink Ticket Office.
2. You can use your foreign-issued Mastercard® and Visa contactless bank cards issued outside of Singapore for the payment of public transport fares in Singapore. Do take note that admin fees apply for foreign-issued bank cards—you can check out the details at [TransitLink's SimplyGo website](#).
3. Adult Stored Value Smartcard (EZ-link / Nets FlashPay): These cost S\$12 inclusive of card value and come with a stored value of S\$7 for you to use on your commutes. You'll be able to purchase this card at any Transitlink Ticket Office or convenience stores.

\*When travelling by bus, do remember to tap your card again, on the reader located at the rear exit, when you alight. You can also opt to pay bus fares in cash, but ensure you have the exact amount.

#### By taxi

Cabs in Singapore are metered. There may be surcharges depending on when, where and which company's taxi you board. To get a rough idea of the final fare, check with the driver on the surcharges and ask for a receipt at the end of the trip. You can hail a taxi by the roadside or at a taxi stand, which you'll find at most malls, hotels and attractions.

#### By Private Hire transportation services

An alternative to taxis in Singapore would be private hire transportation services. Popular ride hailing apps in Singapore include GRAB, Gojek etc. Key in your pick-up and drop off location to get an estimated fare, and the app will connect you to the nearest available driver. You may download the apps on App Store or Google Play.

### **ELECTRICITY**



The standard electrical current used in Singapore is 220-240 volts AC (50 cycles) and you can use power plugs with three square prongs.
