I have the honour to inform you that, through the formulation of the following recommendations, the second session of the Commission for Weather, Climate, Water and Related Environmental Services and Applications (SERCOM-2), which took place from 17 to 21 October 2022, has recommended to the Executive Council or to the World Meteorological Congress, whichever is applicable, the adoption of proposed amendments to the *Technical Regulations* (WMO-No. 49), Volume I, and the *Manual on Marine Meteorological Services* (WMO-No. 558), Volume I.

- Recommendation 5.1(3)/1 (SERCOM-2) Proposed amendment to the Technical Regulations, Volume I, General Meteorological Standards and Recommended Practices (WMO-No. 49) and update to the Compendium of WMO Competency Frameworks (WMO-No. 1209), addressing aeronautical meteorological personnel (AMP) qualification and competency. To be submitted to the nineteenth session of the World Meteorological Congress.
- Recommendation 5.1(5)/1 (SERCOM-2) Review of BIP-M and BIP-MT (Part VI and Appendix A of Vol. I) of the *Technical Regulations* (WMO-No. 49), presenting a proposed amendment to the *Technical Regulations* (WMO-No. 49), Volume I, addressing the Basic Instruction Package for Meteorologists (BIP-M) and Basic Instruction Package for Meteorological Technicians (BIP-MT). Being submitted to the seventy-sixth Executive Council through document EC-76/Doc. 3.1(3) and to be submitted to the nineteenth session of the World Meteorological Congress.
- Recommendation 5.1(7)/1 (SERCOM-2) Amendments to the *Manual on Marine Meteorological Services* (WMO-No. 558), Volume I, presenting a proposed amendment addressing the modernization of the Global Maritime Distress and Safety System (GMDSS) and new structures established through WMO governance reform. Being submitted to the seventy-sixth session of the Executive Council through document EC-76/Doc. 3.1(4).
- Recommendation 5.1(8)/1 (SERCOM-2) Proposed amendment to the Technical Regulations, Volume I, General Meteorological Standards and Recommended Practices (WMO-No. 49), addressing the application of the Common Alerting Protocol (CAP) for the dissemination of warning information. To be submitted to the nineteenth session of the World Meteorological Congress.
