It is a pleasure to inform you WMO will launch the First State of Global Water Resources report for the year 2021, as formulated in the WMO operational plan. This milestone report is designed to gather key hydrological information about changes in our water environment. WMO plans to publish this report annually, from this year on. Operational water management, policy development and climate change mitigation and adaptation action will benefit from this report.

The State of Global Water Resources report will help us to quantify the effect of environmental change and anthropogenic influence on the hydrological status. This WMO flagship report will present an overall picture of the available water resources in different basins globally during the previous year and allows for the assessment of water resources and threats with respect to mean conditions. It also provides an insight into the change in current conditions compared to historical water data. Complementing WMO's Annual State of the Climate Report, the water report will allow assessing the impact of activities targeted at integrated water and climate action at the global level, and hence help Members and other organizations in better planning and management of their resources.
