Sir/Madam,

I have the honour of addressing you on the matter of the final round of written comments by governments on the Final Draft of the 2013 Supplement to 2006 IPCC Guidelines for National Greenhouse Gas Inventories: Wetlands (Wetlands Supplement). This is the third stage of IPCC-mandated reviews prior to the formal adoption/acceptance that will take place at the 37th Session of the IPCC (IPCC-37) to be held in Batumi, Georgia, from 14 to 18 October 2013.

In 2010, the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) invited the IPCC to undertake further methodological work on wetlands, focusing on the rewetting and restoration of peatland, with a view to filling in the gaps in the 2006 IPCC Guidelines for National Greenhouse Gas Inventories (2006 IPCC Guidelines). In May the following year, during its 33rd Session in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates, the IPCC asked its Task Force on National Greenhouse Gas Inventories (TFI) to undertake the work to develop additional national-level inventory methodological guidance on wetlands to address the gaps identified in the 2006 IPCC Guidelines.

Following an IPCC call for nominations in May 2011 to member governments and observer organizations for experts to contribute to the *Wetlands Supplement*, Coordinating Lead Authors, Lead Authors and Review Editors were selected from the large number of nominations received by the Bureau of the TFI in August and September 2011. As changes in the authors list have taken place since the beginning of the nomination process, the updated list of authors is attached for your information.

Two previous drafts of the *Wetlands Supplement* have been subject to scientific and technical review by experts from 16 April 2012 to 11 June 2012 and by governments and experts from 11 February 2013 to 7 April 2013 (for Chapter 2, from 18 February 2013 to 14 April 2013), as called for in the IPCC Procedures for the Preparation, Review, Acceptance, Adoption, Approval and Publication of IPCC Reports (Appendix A to the Principles Governing IPCC Work, the "IPCC Procedures"). The drafts have been revised by the authors after both of these reviews in response to comments received, and this process has produced the Final Draft of the *Wetlands Supplement*. The first review of the Overview Chapter took place at the time of the Government and Expert Review.

In accordance with the IPCC Procedures, the Final Draft of the Overview Chapter will be submitted for section-by-section adoption by the IPCC-37 and the full Final Draft Report will be submitted for acceptance by the IPCC-37. Selected Coordinating Lead Authors and selected Review Editors will be present at the Session to assist the TFI Co-chairs and to facilitate consideration by the IPCC of the *Wetlands Supplement*.

Following the IPCC Procedures and in order to facilitate the adoption of the Overview Chapter and the acceptance of the full report and to ensure an efficient conduct of IPCC-37, your Government is invited to submit written comments on the Final Draft of the *Wetlands Supplement* in the period from **12 August to 8 September 2013**.
