Subject: IPCC Special Report on Climate Change and Land

Sir/Madam,

I have the honour of addressing you on the matter of the Government and Expert Review of the IPCC Special Report on Climate Change and Land: *An IPCC Special Report on climate change, desertification, land degradation, sustainable land management, food security, and greenhouse gas fluxes in terrestrial ecosystems.* 

You may recall that at the 43<sup>rd</sup> Session of the IPCC (Nairobi, Kenya, 11-13 April 2016), the Panel agreed to prepare a Special Report on Climate Change and Land (SRCCL). Following a Scoping Meeting (Dublin, Ireland, 13 – 16 February 2017), the outline of the Special Report on Climate Change and Land was approved at the 45<sup>th</sup> Session of the IPCC (Guadalajara, Mexico, 28-31 March 2017). Following an IPCC call for nominations in April 2017 to member governments and observer organizations for experts to participate in the production of the SRCCL, Coordinating Lead Authors, Lead Authors and Review Editors were selected by the Working Group I, II and III Bureaux from the large number of nominations received.

The SRCCL First Order Draft (FOD) was available for expert review from 11 June to 5 August 2018. The report has now been revised by the authors in response to comments received and the Second Order Draft (SOD) will undergo simultaneous review by governments and experts.

The Government and Expert Review of the SRCCL SOD is a key element of the IPCC assessment process. The purpose of this review is to help ensure that the report provides a balanced and comprehensive assessment of the latest scientific findings. The IPCC Procedures state that the review process shall be objective, open and transparent, with a wide circulation that aims to involve as many independent experts as possible in the IPCC process, seeking a range of views, expertise, and geographical representation. To this end your review comments will be most helpful if they:

- Address specific text, tables or figures in the draft and provide clear suggestions for changes in wording or content where appropriate. Please provide full references for any additional literature cited in a review comment.
- Recognize the specific mandates of IPCC and of Working Group I, II and III together with the approved outline of the report and do not require the authors to go beyond that scope.
- Ensure that any suggested changes to the Summary for Policymakers (SPM) of the report are fully consistent with material in the chapters of the report and provide cross references to that material.





- Recognize that the authors are required to work within strict length constraints and must present a concise assessment of current knowledge, not a scientific review of how that knowledge was derived.
- Give attention to ways of shortening the chapters and the SPM of the report where possible.

The review process will follow standard IPCC procedures <sup>1</sup>. These procedures advise that governments should send one integrated set of comments for each report to the appropriate Working Group Bureau Co-Chairs through their Government Focal Points. For your information, all experts who contributed comments on the FOD will be notified directly about the review of the SOD and invited to submit a review. An expert reviewer may also be asked to participate in the government review organized within his or her own country. In such a case, he/she should submit comments either as an individual or as part of the government review, but not both.

The Government and Expert Review of the SRCCL SOD will take place from 19 November 2018 to 14 January 2019, 23:59 (GMT+1).

## **Government Review**

I kindly invite you to submit your government comments by **14 January 2019**, **23:59 (GMT+1)**. Given the tight timeline for the preparation of the SRCCL, we regret that delays to the schedule cannot be accommodated. The review comments will be compiled immediately and thus it will not be possible to submit comments after the deadline.

The Lead Authors will consider the review comments on their chapters at a meeting to be held on 11-15 February 2019 and Review Editors for each chapter will ensure that all substantive comments receive appropriate consideration. A final draft of the report will be sent to Governments in May 2019 and a Joint Working Group Session to approve the SPM and accept the underlying report will take place in 2019.

Please note that all government comments will be attributable by country and made publicly available from the IPCC website following the final approval and publication of the report.

All review comments must be submitted by means of the SOD review site by **Monday 14 January 2019**, **23:59 (GMT+1)**.
