Dear Sir/Madam,

The IPCC has consistently highlighted the urgent funding needs of the IPCC Data Distribution Centre (DDC), emphasizing the importance of sustained finance for its operations. Despite efforts dating back several years, including calls during the 47<sup>th</sup> Session of the IPCC in 2018<sup>1</sup> for more robust and sustainable resourcing options, challenges persist in securing adequate funding for the DDC's activities.

The Panel at its 60<sup>th</sup> Session (Istanbul, Türkiye, 16 – 19 January 2024) allocated CHF 200,000 (Two Hundred Thousand Swiss Francs) for DDC activities towards the completion of remaining tasks associated with the Sixth Assessment Cycle. As contingencies, CHF 400,000 (Four Hundred Thousand Swiss Francs) and CHF 700,000 (Seven Hundred Swiss Francs) were included in the forecast budgets for 2025 and 2026, respectively.

Over the past years, the institutions that formed part of the DDC include the Center for International Earth Science Information Network (CIESIN; United States of America), MetaDataWorks (United Kingdom), Centre for Environmental Data Analysis (CEDA; United Kingdom), Deutsches Klimarechenzentrum (DKRZ; Germany) and the Consejo Superior de Investigaciones Cientificas (CSIC; Spain). An exception being the DKRZ that has formally withdrawn its services from the DDC, all the other institutions have indicated their availability and willingness to continue providing DDC services, contingent on the availability of resources.

In light of the above, Member countries and observer organizations are kindly urged to consider supporting the work of the DDC in the Seventh Assessment Cycle. The solicited support could take the form of:

- funds transmitted to the IPCC Trust Fund, earmarked for DDC activities. Alternatively, funds could be disbursed directly to the DDC nodes without transiting the IPCC Trust Fund, which is the most preferred option; and
- in-kind contributions in support of DDC work, including through the Expression of Interest
  to provide the services of archiving climate model data used for climate simulations and
  projections assessed by the IPCC, particularly the output from the Coupled Model
  Intercomparison Project (CMIP) and Coordinated Regional Downscaling Experiment
  (CORDEX). This is part of the role that was played by the DKRZ.
