Dear Sir/Madam,

With my letters of 4 June 2025, ref. 5161-25/IPCC/GEN, ref. 5162-25/IPCC/GEN and ref. 5163-25/IPCC/GEN, I invited IPCC Member countries, Observer Organizations and Bureau members to nominate experts to participate in the upcoming co-located IPCC Workshop on Engaging Diverse Knowledge Systems (EDKS) and Workshop on Methods of Assessment (MA) taking place at the University of Reading in Reading, United Kingdom, from 10 to 12 February 2026.

The selection of participants in these workshops has now been finalized by the Scientific Steering Committee (SSC) leading the organization of the workshops. Kindly note that 673 experts were nominated and 76 experts were selected to participate, in addition to the SSC members.

In accordance with the principles governing IPCC work, the Scientific Steering Committee carefully considered the nominations and developed the final list of participants. The selection was undertaken considering the required scientific, technical and socio-economic views and expertise, geographical representation, gender balance, and the inclusion of experts with and without previous IPCC experience.

We warmly thank you for the nominations you submitted and have the pleasure to include as an annex the list of selected participants.

It is expected that Member countries and Observer Organizations that are in a position to do so provide travel and subsistence support for the selected participants to attend this event. Where one may not be in a position to provide such support, the IPCC Trust Fund will endeavour to provide travel and subsistence support for selected participants from developing countries and countries with economies in transition.

We thank you in advance for your consideration of this matter.
