I am pleased to inform you that the India Meteorological Department (IMD) will be hosting the fourteenth Asia-Oceania Meteorological Satellite Users' Conference (AOMSUC-14) in conjunction with a training event and a Joint Regional Association (RA) RA II (Asia) – RA V (South-West Pacific) Coordination Meeting to be held in New Delhi, India, from 2 to 7 December 2024. AOMSUC-14 and associated events will be conducted face-to-face. More details on the events can be found at the following website: https://nmsc.imd.gov.in/aomsuc/.

Past AOMSUC events have proven to be very effective in the following domains: promoting satellite observations and advancing application areas; focusing on regional issues; informing on recent advances in remote sensing science; fostering the dialogue between satellite operators and the user community on current and future satellites; and engaging young scientists. This conference is the preeminent scientific and technical event in the Asia-Pacific region for those working in the area of satellite remote sensing with applications in meteorology, climatology, oceanography, and related fields.

In this regard, I would like to invite you and your representatives to participate in the three events to be hosted by IMD:

- 1. Training event on satellite data and product utilization: 2-3 December 2024;
- Fourteenth Asia-Oceania Meteorological Satellite Users' Conference: 4-6 December 2024;

It is hoped that the cost of participation of your National Meteorological and Hydrological Services (NMHS) experts will be borne by your organization. There are no registration fees associated with this conference.

If it is not possible, IMD and WMO are prepared to consider, upon request, providing financial support which may consist of travel cost (most economic airfare according to the most direct route) and/or per diem.

Regarding insurance, pursuant to Chapter 6 of WMO Standing Instructions on Official Travel, non-staff members retain the primary obligation to ensure that they have the appropriate medical and travel insurance coverage when travelling on behalf of WMO. This means that if any health or travel related eventuality should occur, the non-staff member should seek assistance and claim their coverage from an insurance policy that they have taken out.

> Non-staff members of WMO who are authorized to travel at the Organization's expense and/or who are receiving a DSA from WMO must ensure they are fully responsible for expenses incurred in the event of death, illness or injury during official travel and attendance at meetings on behalf of the Organization. They are, therefore, fully responsible for arranging life, health, and accident, as well as any other forms of insurance with an adequate level of coverage for the duration of such meetings and events.

WMO liability is limited to the performance of services or attendance at a meeting on behalf of the Organization, is covered by an injury and illness benefit insurance which provides limited coverage for medical, emergency, and supplementary official travel expenses.

It should be noted that WMO does retain limited liability with respect to activities directly attributable to the performance of services or attendance at relevant meetings. This coverage, however, relating to medical, emergency and supplementary official travel should not be considered as a viable alternative to taking out private insurance.

Travellers should also note that the WMO Convention, General Regulations, Staff Regulations, Financial Regulations and Agreements (*Basic documents No. 1* (WMO-No. 15)) do not cover additional costs arising from the prolongation of the stay of experts or other costs arising from travel restrictions imposed by national authorities. As with related health insurance provisions it is incumbent on the traveller to ensure that they retain the necessary travel insurance protection to cover unexpected occurrences such as border closures or other travel restrictions.

For administrative purposes I should be grateful if you would kindly notify the WMO Secretariat (Ms Zoya Andreeva, zandreeva@wmo.int) and the local organizing committee at IMD (aomsuc14imd@gmail.com) at your earliest convenience, but not later than **15 September 2024**, whether you or your representative will be able to attend the above meetings and if so, whether any financial assistance will be required.

I look forward to the participation of your NMHS experts in these important meetings.
