Madame, Monsieur,

J'ai le plaisir de vous informer qu'à l'aimable invitation du Gouvernement des Samoa, la quatorzième session du Comité des cyclones tropicaux pour le Pacifique Sud et le sud-est de l'océan Indien relevant du CR V (Pacifique Sud-Ouest) se tiendra à Apia, Samoa, du 16 au 20 juillet 2012. Vous trouverez l'ordre du jour provisoire annoté et une note d'information à l'intention des participants dans les annexes I et II respectivement. Il est à noter que cette session sera précédée de l'Atelier régional sur les progrès accomplis en matière de prévention des catastrophes dues aux tsunamis dans les pays insulaires du Pacifique et sur les produits améliorés proposés par le Centre d'alerte aux tsunamis dans le Pacifique (PTWC) (12-13 juillet 2012) et de la Réunion du Groupe intergouvernemental de coordination du Système d'alerte aux tsunamis et de mitigation dans le Pacifique (ICG/PTWS) (14 juillet 2012), les deux manifestations étant organisées au même endroit par la COI de l'UNESCO.

En vertu de la résolution 7 (XV-CR V), votre pays étant représenté au sein du Comité, je vous invite à désigner un ou plusieurs experts susceptibles d'assister à cette session.

Les participants à la session débattront des aspects météorologiques des systèmes d'alerte aux cyclones tropicaux ainsi que de certains aspects des services hydrologiques et de réduction des risques de catastrophes liés au programme du Comité. Je me permets par conséquent de suggérer qu'en ce qui concerne la désignation de représentants à la session, vous teniez compte de l'intérêt qu'offre pour le Comité le fait de disposer d'avis d'experts dans ces domaines et que des représentants du Service météorologique national et des organisations nationales de réduction des risques de catastrophes de votre pays participent à la session.

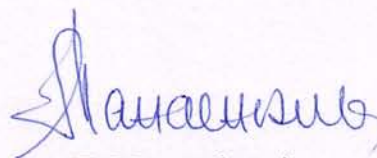

PROVISIONAL ANNOTATED AGENDA**1. ORGANIZATION OF THE SESSION****1.1 Opening of the session**

At the kind invitation of the Government of Samoa, the fourteenth session of the RA V Tropical Cyclone Committee for the South Pacific and South-East Indian Ocean will be held in Apia, Samoa from 16 to 20 July 2012.

1.2 Adoption of the agenda

The provisional agenda, contained in RA V/TCC-XIV/Doc. 1, will be submitted to the session for adoption. The order of the agenda may be modified during the session and additional items be added.

1.3 Election of the Vice-chairperson

In accordance with Regulation 32 of the WMO General Regulations, Resolution 7 (XV-RA V) and paragraph 5.1.13 of the final report of XV-RA V, Mr M. Bergin (Australia) was designated as Chairperson of the Committee. The Committee may wish to elect a Vice-chairperson.

1.4 Working arrangement of the session

The working language will be English only. Small working groups may be established, if required, to consider specific subjects and thereby to facilitate the work of the session. Pre-session documentation and the provisional report, as well as the final report of the session, will also be in English only. Under this item, the Committee will decide on its working hours and any other arrangements for the session.

2. REPORT OF THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE COMMITTEE

The Chairperson of the Committee will present to the session a brief report on the main development, achievements and challenges that arose since its thirteenth session (Bali, Indonesia, 26 - 29 April 2010) and suggest major points to be discussed in the present session.

3. COORDINATION WITHIN THE WMO TROPICAL CYCLONE PROGRAMME

A summary report on the status of implementation of the Tropical Cyclone Programme (TCP) will be submitted to the Committee in a document to be prepared by the Secretariat, which will provide an overview of the whole range of activities being conducted under TCP. The report will be presented by the WMO Secretariat with a focus on its relevance to the Region. The Committee is invited to comment on the activities within TCP and make proposals for further development of the programme and its closer linkage with the Committee and other RA V Working Groups.

4. REVIEW OF THE 2010/2011 AND 2011/2012 CYCLONE SEASONS

4.1 Summary of the cyclone seasons

The Regional Specialized Meteorological Centre (RSMC) Nadi, Tropical Cyclone Warning Centres (TCWC) will be invited to make a presentation of an in-depth review of the 2010/2011 and 2011/2012 cyclone seasons.

4.2 Reports of Members on the impact of cyclones

Members who have experienced impact of cyclones and/or other severe weather events during these two seasons will be invited to submit to the session concise reports on the functioning of the warning systems, lessons to be derived from these events, measures already taken as a consequence and proposals, if any. The Committee may wish to review these reports and discuss operational matters and shortcomings with a view to improving tropical cyclone warning services.

5. LINKAGE WITH THE WMO REGIONAL PROJECTS

5.1 Severe Weather Forecast and Disaster Risk Reduction Demonstration Project (SWFDDP)

A progress report on the Severe Weather and Disaster Risk Reduction Demonstration Project (SWFDDP) will be presented to the Committee. The Committee will be invited to offer guidance for implementation of SWFDDP in the future. The Committee will also discuss ways to enhance the synergetic effect between its activities and the Project.

5.2 Storm Surge Advisory Arrangement

The Committee is invited to consider establishment of the regional Storm Surge Watch Scheme (SSWS) in consideration of the recommendation made at its 13th session in 2010 which was endorsed subsequently by XV-RA V. In this regard, the Committee will be informed by the WMO Secretariat of the progress of Coastal Inundation Forecasting Demonstration Project (CIFDP) and its linkage with SSWS.

6. REVIEW OF THE TROPICAL CYCLONE OPERATIONAL PLAN FOR THE SOUTH PACIFIC AND SOUTH-EAST INDIAN OCEAN

There will be a discussion on strengthening of the tropical cyclone warning system in the Region taking into consideration identified recent issues related to shortcomings in the Tropical Cyclone Operational Plan for the South Pacific and South-East Indian Ocean,

7. REVIEW OF THE TECHNICAL PLAN AND ITS IMPLEMENTATION PROGRAMME

The Committee, at its thirteenth session, formulated a Technical Plan for the development of services for the period 2010-2014, focussing on activities that could be pursued cost-effectively in the near future. Each member of the Committee is expected to provide a brief report on the status of its respective Service's implementation of the Plan. The WMO Secretariat is also expected to present a report on the subject.

7.1 Meteorological component

The review of this component of the Technical Plan should be undertaken in the light of information presented by the WMO Secretariat and participants at the session on the present status of implementation of the WWW, and the needs for additional data, facilities and arrangements of the purpose of tropical cyclone detection, monitoring and forecasting. This component of the plan should also reflect the overall planning for modernization of Meteorological Services to strengthen the tropical cyclone warning system.

7.2 Hydrological component

The Committee will be invited to review the activities implemented at national and regional levels under the hydrological component of its Technical Plan on the basis of information presented by the WMO Secretariat and provided by participants at the session. The Committee will be informed of the relevant activities of the RAV Working Group on Hydrological Services being undertaken in the Region. The Committee may wish to make proposals for the future implementation of this component.

7.3 Disaster prevention and preparedness component

The Committee will be invited to review the disaster prevention and preparedness component of its Technical Plan within the framework of the decisions of the Sixteenth World Meteorological Congress. The reports from the Committee's members on the 2010-11 and 2011-12 cyclone seasons to be considered under agenda item 4 may also be lead to discussions under this item agenda.

7.4 Training Component

There is a continuing need for further development in the field of training related to tropical cyclones for its Members countries, particularly the organization of special training courses and workshops. Information will be provided on the relevant education and training activities of WMO to assist the Committee in identifying and formulating requirements for future training activities. In this connection, development of tropical cyclone forecasting competence standards will be discussed.

7.5 Research component

A document will be provided by the WMO Secretariat to assist the Committee in its deliberations on this item. It will focus on the follow-up actions to the Seventh WMO International Workshop on Tropical Cyclones (IWTC-VII, La Réunion, 15 to 20 November 2010). It will also provide information on activities of interest to the Committee under the WMO World Research Programme (WWRP).

8. ASSISTANCE REQUIRED FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAMME FOR FUTURE DEVELOPMENT

The WMO Secretariat will provide information on the assistance pertinent to the implementation of the Committee's programme for future development of services and strengthening the operational plan.

9. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Any other business items requiring the attention of the Committee, but not covered by other agenda items, will be considered. The following items have been proposed:

- (i) Pacific Meteorological Desk Partnership
- (ii) Support to RSMC Nadi
- (iii) Support to Tsunami Early Warning System in the South-West Pacific

10. DATE AND PLACE OF THE FIFTEENTH SESSION

The Committee may wish to set an appropriate date for its fifteenth session and offers from Members to host the session would be welcomed.

Meeting arrangements

3. The session will be conducted in English only and all working documents, as well as the provisional and final reports of the session, will be available in English only.
4. It is planned that the opening ceremony will begin at 9:30 a.m. on 16 July 2012. Registration of participants will start at 8:00 a.m. on 16 July 2012 at the registration desk located close to the meeting room. Participants will receive identification badges at the time of registration.

Entry requirements
